**Getting more Distance

Are there times when you need just a little more distance? This Next Sunday we will be working on adding more distance to our basic cast. Discover the hidden but important ideas that will help you increase your distance.

Questions to be answered :

- How does the lift effective my casting stroke?
- How does the anchor position help the forward cast?
- How do I get to the "Key" position?
- How do the two hands work "together" to make the cast effective?
- Can smoothness make a difference in distance?

Understanding the stages of a spey cast, how much effort is applied during each of the stages and how to blend the stages together will produce effective and efficient spey casting. When watching an accomplished spey caster, one notices the smoothness and seeming effortlessness of the casting motion. If you put understanding and practice together, the results are very noticeable in your casting.

Come down to the gravel bar and work on the smooth connections and develop a bit more distance to your spey casting.

### **Success at the NW Fly Tyer's Expo**

**This is your opportunity to help control Sea lions in the Columbia River. Even if you don't fish there... please urge federal officials to move forward on the Oregon/Washington/Idaho request for lethal take of sea lions in the upper Columbia.**

Oregon, Washington and Idaho game agencies have petitioned for such action under the Marine Mammal Protection Act.

The Secretary of Commerce has found the State's application provided sufficient evidence to warrant establishing a Pinniped-Fishery Interaction Task Force.

Public comments are being solicited prior to April 2, 2007. In addition to supporting SJM 15 you should post your own comments. You can do so by an e-mail to:

**We also urge your support for 4 Priority Measures identified by Oregon Anglers.**

#1. Support SJM 15 – Introduced at request of **Oregon Anglers** et al. Urging the lethal removal of California sea lions eating protected salmon and steelhead in the Columbia River

#2. Support HB 2877 - Introduced at the request of **Oregon Anglers**. This extends the existing public access to Oregon's beaches to the Territorial Sea. (Essentially, the first 3 miles of the ocean.) There is a major effort to administratively lock up a large network of Marine Reserves off the Oregon beaches. This would, at least, guarantee the public's right to cross the Reserves for access to other waters.

#3 Support SB 680 - This instructs ODF&W to develop a 25-year plan to "enhance opportunities for angling in Oregon." Every body has a long range plan ... but ODF&W.

#4. Support HB 2940 – Introduced at the request of **Oregon Anglers**. Which provides for license and equipment forfeiture for repetitive or outrageous violation of Oregon's game laws.
